# Welcome, Jeremy Posadas!

We joyfully welcome our newest Board Member, Dr. Jeremy Posadas, who will be serving in the role of Secretary. Jeremy has long worked in solidarity with Extraordinary Lutheran Ministries through his involvement with the LGBTQ justice movement in the ELCA. Jeremy was a leader in the grassroots efforts leading up to the 2009 ELCA Churchwide policy ending the ELCA's prohibition against blessing same-gender relationships and authorizing the ministry of people in them. Jeremy served in previous roles as Board Secretary of ReconcilingWorks (then called Lutherans Concerned/North America), as a member of Pastor Bradley Schmeling's legal defense team during his ecclesiastical trial and appeal, and especially as one of the chief drafters, organizers, and strategists on the Goodsoil

Legislative Team, the group that coordinated grassroots efforts to change ELCA policies regarding same-gender relationships.

We celebrate Jeremy's gift for language and desire to organize for social change. In welcoming Jeremy to the ELM Board, we wanted to highlight a few of his contributions to the movement to open the ELCA's doors to all. Jeremy wrote the first legislative action taken anywhere in the ELCA following its 2005 refusal to end its discriminatory policies, and he drafted a resolution calling for the ELCA to receive ordained members of the ELM roster as ELCA pastors, which was eventually adopted by 15 synods with the support of hundreds of ELCA members. He says that one particularly gratifying accomplishment was helping craft the resolution helped reinstate St. Francis and First United as congregations of the ELCA.

"I have always admired ELM's commitment to empowering LGBTQ people doing transformative ministry NOW, and I am excited to be part of ELM as it brings that vision to even wider circles throughout the church," says Jeremy.

Raised in a fundamentalist Southern Baptist family of Filipino immigrants, Jeremy has been an ELCA member since middle school. He trained for justice-focused parish ministry at Union Theological Seminary NYC and at Trinity Lutheran Church of Manhattan (under the mentorship of Pastor Heidi Neumark). But in pursuing his PhD at Emory University, his vocation shifted to the ministry of justice-oriented teaching, and he is currently appointed to teach "critical theological studies" on the tenure-track at Austin College, a small liberal arts college an hour north of Dallas. His partner Kevin Lotz is the founding director of Trinity Place Shelter, a 10-bed transitional shelter in Manhattan for homeless LGBTQ youth, and a PhD student in social work at New York University.


