Extraordinary Candidacy

The ELCA's decision to open its candidacy process to people in same-sex relationships has led to big changes in ELM's candidacy work. ELM spent time this past year discerning the needs of LGBTQ candidates and how ELM could best meet those needs. The result was the launch of a new candidacy accompaniment program. ELM donors are helping ELM create this grassroots program to accompany LGBTQ people in Lutheran candidacy. As we begin this new program, we look back and honor ELM's candidacy work in the past.

History

Extraordinary candidacy was a movement that developed in response to the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America's policy requiring celibacy for gay and lesbian clergy. Or, as Mari Irvin described it, it was a "little group in a living room" committed to developing an alternative candidacy process for LGBT seminarians. This process was for people who were called to ordained Lutheran ministry, but who also viewed their sexuality and relationships as gifts from God. Early volunteers based the process on the ELCA candidacy process, with the expectation that the ELCA would one day change its policies and welcome these clergy as ELCA pastors.

The work began in 1993 as the Extraordinary Candidacy Project. Margaret Moreland served as the president from its inception until January 2002. Rev. Jeff Johnson, Grady Kase, Mari Irvin and Fred Wolfe have all served in leadership roles with ELM candidacy over the years. Rev. Jeff Johnson looks back on his work with the candidacy project and sums it up as "people of faith getting together to take the steps necessary to move things forward."

Mari Irvin reflected with these words, "The courage of those who sought ECP candidacy continues to impress me. The memories I hold most dear are those of the approval interviews. Those who went through the approval process each had a unique story of faithfulness to

In early April ELM launched another new program, Proclaim. Proclaim is a new professional community for publicly-identified LGBTQ Lutheran rostered leaders and seminarians. Proclaim members are LGBTQ rostered leaders who seek to renew and transform Lutheran congregations and ministries and serve God’s people by bringing the Good News.

Proclaim offers its members:

- Professional development and support
- Participation in the annual leaders’ retreat.
- Eligibility to apply for ELM grants
- Eligibility to apply for Joel Workin seminarian scholarship
- Access to online community resources – job opportunities, resource sharing & community support

Proclaim launched during the annual ELM rostered leaders’ retreat, held this year at Lake Geneva, Wisconsin. The retreat offers a time for community and professional development. 60 people attended, including fifteen seminarians. Thanks to ELM supporters, we were able to provide 18 scholarships, which allowed people from across the country to attend the retreat.

Proclaim is open to any Lutheran clergy or rostered lay leader who publicly identifies as lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, and/or queer. Proclaim also welcomes entranced seminarians to the community. You can learn more and download a membership form by visiting www.elm.org/proclaim. 🍂
