# Extraordinary Lutheran Ministries Program Director Position Description

## The Organization

Extraordinary Lutheran Ministries (ELM) is a self-funded social ministry organization that believes the public witness of gender and sexual minority ministers transforms the church and enriches the world. ELM does this work through three main programs: Proclaim, Accompaniment, and Ministry Engagement. Learn more at www.elm.org

## **About the position:**

The program director builds and supports community through the Proclaim program; journeys alongside and equips candidates through the Accompaniment program; works to expand call opportunities at all levels of the church through the Ministry Engagement program; recruits, develops, and equips volunteer leaders for each program; and works collaboratively with the executive director, associate director, and the program & administrative assistant on strategic work and communications for these programs. The program director supervises one (part-time) staff person.

ELM is seeking a visionary leader for its programs during this time of rapid change and transition.

#### ELM expects that all its staff members will...

- Cultivate an organizational culture rooted in faith, grounded in radical love and hospitality, clear with purpose, dependent on collaboration, and transparent in motives.
- Speak to the intersectionality of injustice and oppression, calling ourselves, our community and the larger church to greater awareness of injustice and commitment to ending oppression.

## Primary Responsibilities

## Called to Proclaim

Proclaim is the professional community for gender and sexual minority rostered ministers and candidates for ministry. The program director actively cultivates this community by doing the following:

- Leads and recruits the teams responsible for planning the Gathering an annual in-person gathering of 70-100 Proclaim members for community building, learning, and renewal
  - Manage budget, coordinate volunteers, speakers, program, worship, social activities, scholarship awards, etc.
- Supports the program & administrative assistant in managing logistics for the Gathering, such as managing registration, booking and working with a retreat center, planning transportation, etc.
- Works with the volunteers on the Proclaim Team (the community's leadership team) to develop and live into a shared vision for the program
- Provides support for local events and gatherings such as Proclaim Regional Meet-Ups
- Coordinates Proclaim chaplains (4) who provide pastoral care, support, and guidance to members of the Proclaim community

- Serves as the initial point of welcome and contact for new Proclaim members, manages volunteers who coordinate welcome and orientation
- Implements social networking: uses Facebook (and possibly other mediums) to spread information about upcoming events, action alerts and celebrations in the community
- Connects with executive director on confidential matters concerning individuals coming out, candidacy, call, and personal and professional boundaries
- Works with associate director of development and communications to generate Proclaim-ing! monthly e-newsletter, write program related content for ELM print and online communications,
- Consults with program and administrative assistant to keep accurate records of Proclaim members internally, for Proclaim Directory, and publicly on the website

## Called to Accompany

ELM recognizes that movement through theological education and the route to ordination or consecration is a time of great vulnerability for LGBTQIA+ candidates, both personally and professionally. To support individuals in this process the program director:

- Recruits and equips volunteers on the Accompaniment Team to journey alongside candidates and respond to rapidly shifting areas of greatest need
- Visits seminaries to preach and offer presentations on ELM and to meet with staff, faculty, and students
- Handles complex candidacy cases with discretion
- Works with volunteer convener of First-Call Coaches to provide support to first-call candidates
- Works with volunteer convener of the Seminarian Outreach Team to provide support to LGBTQIA+ seminarians
- Develops volunteer leadership for a candidacy mentoring team which can respond to candidates' unique requests for conversation about upcoming interviews, difficulties they are encountering, or feedback on their essays
- Develops, maintains, and promotes resources that further support those called to ministry and the larger church

#### Called to Engage

Serving as a point of connection to congregations, synods, and the larger Lutheran church, the program director:

- Develops the leadership of a volunteer program team to run and provide vision for the program
- Reminds congregations and synods of their vocation to equip new leaders for ministry and prepare them to support leaders who are or may be LGBTQIA+
- Collaborates with the executive director to develop initiatives that will enhance the visibility, calls, and ministries of LGBTQIA+ individuals
- Develops, maintains, and promotes resources that open up ministry opportunities for gender and sexual minority candidates and rostered ministers
- Works with volunteers and program & administrative assistant to recruit synod assembly table hosts, register tables, ensure resource supplies are stocked, and coordinate mailings to table hosts
- Works with volunteer convener of Local Contacts to equip volunteers to connect their synod staff and congregations with our resources, share strategies that are working, and generate ideas

#### Called to Partner

- Prepares program reports for ELM Board of Directors meetings, attends in-person meetings of the Board (twice annually), and other meetings as necessary
- Occasionally, as needed, travels to congregations, ministry sites and ministry partners as outreach for ELM (offer a "temple talk," lead adult forums, speak about becoming a financial supporter of ELM, etc.)
- Occasionally, as needed by executive director: represents ELM at movement and church partner
  events, meetings, and conferences to maintain relationships with national, churchwide and
  synodical staff

## **Prior Experience**

- 3 or more years relevant work experience.
- Anti-oppression training and/or deep cross-cultural experience preferred

#### **Personal Skills and Attributes**

- Entrepreneurial and adaptive
- Highly motivated self-starter
- Experience with leadership development as well as volunteer recruitment, training, and management.
- Experience with program or curriculum development, program management.
- Strong organizational, communication, public speaking, personal and writing skills.
- Fluency in: Google Docs/Microsoft Office Suite. Comfort with social media, internet, email and website searches.
- Knowledge, experience, and passion in working with LGBTQIA+ community in the church or related field or organization, especially those issues faced by trans and gender nonconforming/non-binary people
- Finds joy in daily life and work
- Passionate about justice and full inclusion for gender and sexual minorities
- Familiarity with Extraordinary Lutheran Ministries and Lutheranism preferred.
- Must be legally able to work in the U.S.
- Bilingual (Spanish and English) helpful.

#### **Education and Credentialing**

- Bachelor's Degree required.
- Rostered ministers and those seeking Rostered Ministry preferred, lay people may apply.

#### **Work Demands**

- Full-time (36-hours), exempt
- Location flexible, Program Director works remotely.
- Requires weekend and evening work and travel
